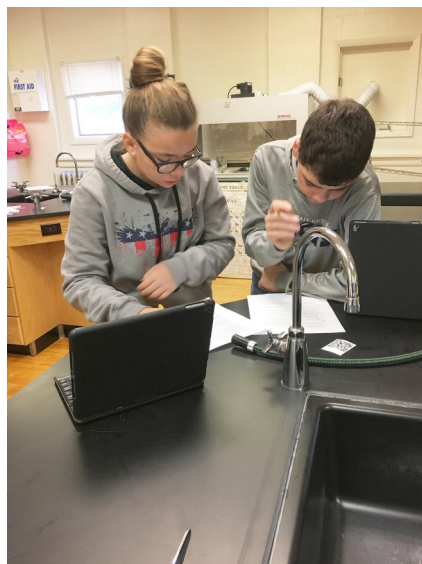
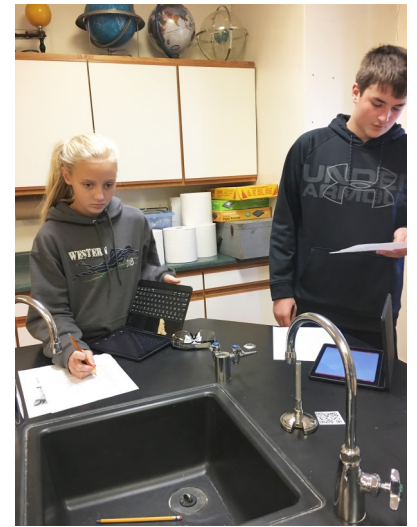

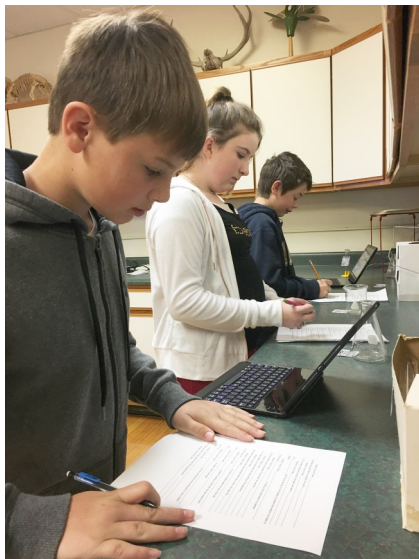


time helping them to become comfortable with working in the lab room.

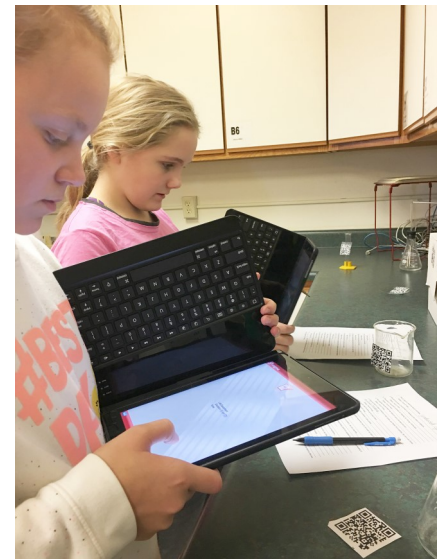

North Star FCCLA, **Inspired** in Atlanta



Five North Star FCCLA members joined over 8,000 members and advisers from across the United States at the 73rd annual Family Career and Community Leaders of America National Leadership Conference in Atlanta, GA, the end of June. Members listened to inspiring speakers, attended workshops and competed at the national level in events related to Family Consumer Sciences education.

Attending from North Star were Katelyn Hansen and Paij Peterson who competed in "Sports Nutrition" where they received a gold medal and placed 8th in the nation for their efforts. They tracked an athlete for a week and then made suggestions for improvement based on the research of basic needs and best practices for optimal success. These ideas were then tailored to the athlete they studied and a comprehensive improvement plan was developed. "I could not be prouder of these girls' effort and their success!" said Marjorie Chinadle, North Star FCCLA Adviser.



Also attending, was Hali Kapperud who was asked to sit on the Nominating Committee for the National Officer team which was quite an experience and an honor. Hali also accepted the Montana award for membership increase at a general session. Grace Farinas and Peytan King, both four-year members, and past national competitors were given the opportunity to be evaluators of projects that came to National Leadership Conference this year. It was a learning experience for them and a wonderful opportunity to see the evaluation side of competitive events. North Star also had a little fun in Atlanta. Our hotel was across the street from the Georgia World Convention Center on one side and next to Olympic Park on the other. We were also connected to CNN Center and had the opportunity to tour CNN and see how worldwide events become the news stories we see and hear every day. Most impressive was the fact-checking and research that goes into each news story. In the evenings, we were able to visit the International headquarters of Coca-Cola, the Georgia Aquarium, and the Martin Luther King Memorial. Students also participated in a bus tour of the historic parts of Atlanta and visited a boutique mall housed in an abandoned factory that was part of the city revitalization project.

The North Star FCCLA group was accompanied by Marjorie Chinadle, North Star FCCLA Adviser as well as Kathy Preeshl and Linda Lett who joined the group as chaperones.
